#### **Minimum Graduation Requirements**

- 1. 120 credit hours
- 2. 45 upper-division credit hours (3000-4999 level)
- 3. 2.0 CU cumulative GPA, 2.5 Business and Emphasis GPA
- Residency: A minimum of 30 credits of course work (to include the 18 credits in the area of emphasis and BGSO 4000 & STRT 4500) as a College of Business student.
